Tomsic, Vice President and General Manager, 5268 Rockwell Drive, NE, JULY 22, 2002 Cedar Rapids, Iowa 52402) for certain public safety communications improvements. These include a new computer assisted dispatch (CAD) system, a new computerized police records system, new voice **SUBJECT:** radio consoles and a mobile data system. PUBLIC SAFETY **COMMUNICATIONS IMPROVEMENTS FISCAL IMPACT -CONTRACT** The initial contract cost is \$5,199,878. Funding has been identified in the Capital Improvements Budget (CP034, ENG990000, BLD079, pg 25). It comes from a variety of sources including the General Fund, TYPE: Equipment Replacement Fund, grants and General Obligation Bonds. This contract is the major part of a larger public safety RESOLUTION communications improvement project that also includes **ORDINANCE** RECEIVE/FILE improvements to the voice radio system and limited improvements to the electrical and mechanical systems in the Communications Center. **SUBMITTED BY: RECOMMENDATION -**WILLIAM H. BACKGROUND-**ARMSTRONG CHIEF** On September 13, 1999, by Roll Call No. 99-2846, the City Council **INFORMATION** approved a Request For Proposals (RFP) for consulting services to **OFFICER** assist with the design, development and implementation of needed public safety communications improvements.

On December 20, 1999, by Roll Call No. 99-3811, the City Council approved the selection of RCC Consultants, Inc. (100 Woodbridge Center Drive, Suite 201, Woodbridge, New Jersey, 07095-1106) to

DOUGLAS RUBIN ACTING FIRE CHIEF provide these services.

The consultant completed the needs assessment for the computeraided dispatch system, records management system, radio consoles, radio system and mobile data system. The report outlined the identified deficiencies, discussed alternative solutions and made recommendations for needed improvements. The consultant's recommendations in summary are:

- · Replace the computerized dispatch and records system
- · Replace the radio consoles
- · Replace the fire status system
- · Voice radio systems remain UHF
- · Obtain and share additional voice channels
- · Improve voice radio coverage
- · Simplify voice patching between agencies

On November 20, 2000, by Roll Call No. 00-4373, the City Council approved a contract with RCC Consultants, Inc. to develop RFPs for the stated communications improvements.

On September 10, 2001, by Roll Call No. 01-2787, the City Council authorized the issuance of the RFPs.

On March 4, 2002, by Roll Call No. 02-623, the City Council approved and adopted the recommendation of the selection of Siemens Transportation Systems, ILG and authorized the City Manager and staff to negotiate a contract with them for services.
