**AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS
FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE DOWNTOWN WALKABILITY STUDY**

WHEREAS, in March of 2013, the City retained Jeff Speck to evaluate ways to make downtown Des Moines more pedestrian and bike friendly; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2015 a Council Workshop presentation was made to City Council regarding the recommendations made by Jeff Speck, author of *Walkable City*, on ways to make downtown Des Moines more pedestrian and bike friendly; and

WHEREAS, conversations with community and corporate leaders are favorable to consider the recommendations and suggested changes from Mr. Speck for downtown which include travel lane reductions, lane width reductions, removal of peak-hour parking restrictions, installation of pedestrian bump outs, and one-way to two-way street conversions; and

WHEREAS, in response the City has prepared a scope of study and Request for Proposals (RFP) for professional services to study the impacts of the suggested changes; and

WHEREAS, the study will result in a multi-modal transportation model which will evaluate Level of Service, traffic patterns, and other operational impacts associated with these changes; and

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DES MOINES, IOWA:
That the City Manager be and is hereby authorized to issue Request for Proposals for the
Downtown Walkability Study.
